3. Did You Know...?

Did you know that WorldMark has a restriction on how many Combines you can do in a year? This is always a good thing to be aware of when deciding the best time to purchase an additional membership to combine with one you already own! The restriction is as follows: You are limited to only one (1) Combine per calendar year and it is effective as of the date that the entire Combine process is completed. For example, if I purchased an additional membership to combine with my existing membership in October 2014 and the Combine paperwork was totally completed in December 2014, then I could turn around and initiate another purchase and Combine in January of 2015 since the restriction applies to the calendar year. So let's say I purchased a membership to combine with my existing membership in December of 2014 and the Combine paperwork wasn't completed until February of 2015, then I

would not be able to do another Combine until the beginning of 2016, because I'd already done one in 2015! You can always purchase as many separate memberships as you'd like within any calendar year, the restriction only applies to Combines. 6. Vacation Highlights - Featuring The Camlin

I had the occasion to stay at WorldMark Seattle—The Camlin twice this past month. My first excursion was a one night stay with my father and brother. We go every year to “The Big Seattle Boat Show” (those of you that live in the Northwest are humming the catchy tune associated with this event in your heads right now). Two bedroom units are hard to come by at The Camlin (they have less than 10 in the whole resort) so we always settle for a one bedroom, and my brother and I flip a coin to see who will sleep on the air mattress in the living room.

We had amazing weather—the day we were there was the hottest January day since 1930—with blue skies and 60 degree weather. We broke out the shorts and flip-flops in celebration. The boat show happens at the end of every January, and if you're at all nautically inclined, I urge you to check it out! <http://www.seattleboatshow.com> Our favorite part is “boats afloat” which is a tour of the many large boats moored on Chandler's Cove. We always eat lunch at Duke's Chowder House <http://www.dukeschowderhouse.com> which is right on the cove—the seafood there is not only delicious, but in keeping with the theme of our trip.

After spending an entire day ogling all of the amazing boats, and climbing on as many as possible, we headed to The Camlin for check-in. Valet parking is \$35, and self-parking is available for slightly less. After we dumped our gear, we headed out to grab

some food and drink—on the recommendation of the concierge, we walked the couple of blocks to The Pine Box. While it was once a mortuary (where Bruce Lee’s funeral was held) it is now a great brew-house/eatery (<http://www.pineboxbar.com/>). We had some great pizza, as well as some truly amazing craft beers. We were pretty beat, so we retired early, where I’m happy to report I won the coin toss for the murphy bed.

My second stay was a trip to the Seattle Symphony with my wife. She’s a big fan of classical music (especially the cello) so we take several trips to Benaroya Hall each year <http://www.seattlesymphony.org/symphony>. We valeted the car this time, and left it parked. In order to get around town we used Uber instead of driving ourselves. The trips to and from The Camlin were only \$5 each—certainly cheaper than a taxi—and no searching for a parking stall. This was my first experience with the “virtual car service” and I will definitely be using it again in the future <https://www.uber.com>.

Before the performance we walked next door to The Dragonfish Café for some sushi and rice beer—show your WorldMark key card and get 20% off your order <http://dragonfishcafe.com>. Afterward, we changed out of our “show clothes” and walked two blocks down to the nearby Cheesecake Factory for a late dinner. They have a great selection of food, and of course the cheesecake is always a hit as well <http://www.thecheesecakefactory.com>.
